### What will we be learning this Term?



Our theme at pre-school this first half term is going to be 'Magical Me' as we are starting our new Pre-school adventure together! This will involve lots of practical work and will develop lots of talking and listening skills along with many opportunities for learning in each of the seven areas of the EYFS. We are going to be learning literacy skills through reading the book 'Owl Babies' by Martin Waddell. We will be completing many exciting activities all about the story both indoors and outdoors. We will be learning many counting rhymes and playing number games within Maths and children will be exploring numbers around the environment. The children will mainly learn through creative and hands on activities. The first few weeks will focus on settling the children in and becoming familiar with routines, rules and making new friends.

The seven areas of learning skills are outlined below in more detail: -

**Communication and Language-** Through games, rhymes and discussions children will be learning how to listen carefully in different contexts. They will be listening in small groups and whole class situations. They will be responding to with relevant comments of their own when listening to stories about families and homes. They will be encouraged to demonstrate an understanding of simple instructions in a range of

**Personal, Social and Emotional Development-** The children will be expected to communicate their needs and to make choices within circle time and when exploring provision areas. They will learn how to

follow rules and boundaries and will be praised and rewarded when they do. Good behaviour will be modelled by the adults in the setting, encouraging children to interact in a positive, polite way. Children will learn to share equipment and to show concern for others.

**Physical Development-** The children will be responding to different types of music and rhymes. They will learn to have awareness of their own space and to move around safely. Children will be expected to go to the toilet independently and to wash their hands. Within PE lessons, children will develop their running and balancing skills. Through funky finger activities, dough disco and squiggle while you wiggle, we will strengthen your children's hands ready for writing. <http://family.co/blog/the-child/parent-guide-physical-development-early-years/>



**Mathematics –** The children will be taking part in singing finger rhymes with numbers. Children will be reciting numbers to and past 5. We will be learning to understand that counting is to find how many. We will be counting claps, jumps, hops etc. Children will explore numbers 1 to 5 and look at how they can be represented. We will sort a variety of objects by colour, size or shape.

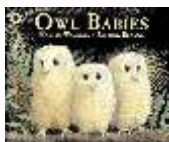

**Literacy-** This term we are going to base our learning 'The Owl Babies' by Martin Waddell. We will also learn many pre-school rhymes, where children will be encouraged to join in, repeating words and phrases. The children will learn how to hold a book correctly and be able to differentiate between the text and the illustrations (words and pictures). The children will be encouraged to do lots of mark-making indoors and outdoors, where they will be shown appreciation for the writing they do. The children will also take part in daily phonics sessions.

**Understanding the World –** This half term we will still be exploring the wonders of the human body. Children will be learning the names of their simple body parts and how we grow and change. We will be looking at our homes and where we live. We will talk about the members of our families and discuss how we are similar and different.
